## 5.1 Army Corps of Engineers and IDNR permit update.

This funding is important because it is money that the FWA would not have to spend from the budget per our original commitment with the IDNR.

- **6.4 MOTION:** Discussion ensued regarding the proposed Fox Waterway Agency 2021 soil pricing at Wall Street. The discussion proposed that there be three categories of materials sold at the site (1) Non-Bulk Materials; (2) Bulk Materials over 4,000 cubic yards; and (3) Municipal Rate. Pricing would be as follows:
  - \$15 per cubic yard for Non-Bulk Materials
  - \$12-\$13 for Bulk Material; and
  - \$10 for Municipal Rate.

After further discussion, a motion was made by Meyer and seconded by Director Haling to authorize the staff, led by the Executive Director, to set a schedule for the FWA 2021 soil pricing at Wall Street, in accordance with the discussion at the Board level, but within the discretion of the staff. - The Trammel will be delivered to Wall Street in the first week in April.
